## COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course will review state-of-the-art strategies for the diagnosis and management of cardiac sarcoidosis. Faculty will use a case-based approach encouraging audience participation and discussion to outline challenges and controversies related to cardiac sarcoidosis.

## OBJECTIVES

- List specific attributes of echocardiography, FDG-PET, and cardiac MRI in the diagnosis and follow-up of cardiac sarcoid
- Identify optimal approaches to risk stratification and treatment of electrophysiologic disturbances in patients with sarcoid
- Evaluate sarcoid patients including identifying those with high likelihood of having disease in the absence of histologic evidence of cardiac sarcoidosis
